**A257 VARIOUS ROADS,
ASH, SANDWICH**

(30 MPH SPEED LIMIT)

TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

For the safety of the public and workforce whilst works to provide a new electricity supply are being carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to impose a temporary mandatory speed limit of 30 mph on sections of roads at the western end of A257 Ash Bypass, Ash, near Sandwich.

A compulsory speed limit of 30 mph will be imposed in both directions on the roads below, extending in the direction shown to converge at the staggered junction with Pedding Hill / Nash Road

- **A257 ASH BYPASS** – westwards from a point approximately 200 metres east of the junction with Nash Road
- **A257 PEDDING HILL** – eastwards from a point approximately 150 metres west of the junction with Nash Road
- **PEDDING HILL** (continuation of Gilton) – westwards from a point approximately 150 metres east of the junction with A257 Ash Bypass
- **NASH ROAD** – southwards from a point approximately 150 metres north of the junction with A257 Ash Bypass

The Speed Limit applies at all times, as and when the relevant signs are clearly displayed on site.

The speed limit is in conjunction with 4-way temporary traffic lights, which may cause some delays at busy times.

Due to the nature of the works, the restrictions will need to remain in force at all times.

This applies from Monday 12 April 2021 for works with expected completion by 16 April 2021.

The planned dates and duration may change for various reasons including the current coronavirus situation and adverse weather conditions, with any changes signposted on site and notified locally.
